About the National Opera Trustee Recognition Awards

The National Opera Trustee Recognition Awards, now in its 17th year, was established to honor opera company trustees for exemplary leadership, support, and service on behalf of their respective opera companies across the country.

OPERA America's commitment to recognizing excellence in governance stems from a core belief that the strength of an opera company is directly linked to the quality of governance demonstrated by its board members. National Opera Trustee Recognition Awards:

- Highlight the tenets of good governance.
- Provide models of trustee and volunteer excellence.
- Amplify the efforts of distinguished trustees to a national audience.
- Strengthen the relationships between trustees and the companies and communities they serve.

Moreover, National Opera Trustee Recognition Awards offer OPERA America's Professional Company Members an opportunity to demonstrate their gratitude and bring national attention to the leaders who play a pivotal role in charting the future of opera in America.

Nomination Process & Eligibility

Every U.S. Professional Company Member in good standing is invited to submit one nomination by responding to the nomination questions provided.

A list of all nomination fields and questions can be found below. Nominations must be submitted online at **<u>operaamerica.org/TrusteeNomination</u>** by **Friday**, **March 21**, **2025**, **5:00 p.m. PDT**.

The nominated trustee must currently be serving on your board of directors. Companies may choose to renominate a previous nominee who was not selected for an award in a previous year. With special permission, a company may be permitted to nominate a recent trustee emeritus or a couple who both serve as trustees.

In responding to the following questions, demonstrate how your nominee has excelled in advancing the work of your company, the strength of your board, your relationship with your community, and your company's long-term sustainability.

- How has your nominee contributed to the success of the company? (max. 2,500 char.)* You might consider ways your nominee has supported staff, contributed to projects, recruited audiences, offered expertise, etc.
- How has your nominee advanced the effectiveness of the board? (max. 2,500 char.)* You might consider ways your nominee has fostered learning, led special initiatives, promoted collaboration, encouraged teamwork, mobilized peers, etc.
- How has your nominee participated in the company's commitment to its community? (max. 2,500 char.)*

You might consider ways your nominee has forged partnerships, made introductions, participated in advocacy, served as an ambassador, etc.

• How has your nominee worked to ensure the long-term health and sustainability of your company? (max. 2,500 char.)* You might consider ways your nominee has negotiated long-term contracts, helped build an endowment, secured multi-year funding, led strategic planning initiatives, etc.

Considerations When Preparing Your Nomination

- The selection committee can only consider what they receive in your written nomination. Your nominee likely excels in all evaluation areas. Make sure your nomination makes that clear.
- Be specific. Provide concrete examples to illustrate how your nominee has impacted the company.
- The selection committee will look for evidence that your nominee has played an active role in the advancement of the company. The accomplishments of your company under your nominee's board tenure are less important than how your nominee helped achieve them.
- Help the committee understand the magnitude of your nominee's impact by qualifying any numerical data; for instance: "Jane tripled the endowment when she raised \$8 million in the campaign" or "Fred recruited nearly half of the 150 people who attended our free community performance."

Selection Process & Criteria

Honorees will be chosen by a selection committee comprising past recipients of National Opera Trustee Recognition Awards. Five honorees will be selected, representing Budget 1, Budget 2, Budget 3, Budget 4, and Budget 5 companies. Notification of winners will be sent to companies and honorees in late April and early May.

The selection committee will review each nomination and assign scores in respect to four criteria:

- 1. The impact of the nominee on the company's success
- 2. The impact of the nominee on the board's effectiveness
- 3. The impact of the nominee on the community
- 4. The impact of the nominee on the company's long-term health and sustainability

Honoree Recognition

OPERA America will work closely with the opera companies of the selected honorees to highlight their achievements and contributions to the field in a national press release. Awardees will be featured in *Opera America Magazine* and on the OPERA America website. All honorees will receive a one-year membership to OPERA America, including a subscription to *Opera America Magazine* and access to online resources.

Awards Dinner

Honorees are invited to attend the OPERA America Salutes awards dinner in the winter of 2026 in New York City (date to be announced). The event, which includes a reception, dinner, awards presentation, and musical program, brings together company leaders and trustees from across the country.

Each honoree will receive two complimentary tickets to the evening; their general director will also receive two complimentary tickets. Additional tickets may be purchased for colleagues, family, and friends. (Please note: OPERA America Salutes is not black tie, and dress for the event is business attire. All additional tickets are priced at cost.)

OPERA America Salutes is a centerpiece of OPERA America's annual National Trustee Week (winter 2026), which includes the National Trustee Forum and additional special events, outings, and performances. Honorees and their guests are invited to participate in other events throughout the weekend; additional costs apply.
