NATIONAL TRUSTEE FORUM

Wednesday, March 18, 1:00 p.m. – 3:30 p.m.

Thursday–Friday, March 19 and 20, 9:30 a.m. – 3:30 p.m.

For the past 20 years, OPERA America's National Trustee Forum has welcomed opera company trustees for a dedicated, multiday symposium on successful practices in board governance.

This year, the 2026 Forum will take on a topical focus, putting the opera business model under a microscope with sessions on audience building, endowment campaigns, board activation, and more. A special series of case studies — featuring the Lyric Opera of Chicago, Bregenzer Festspiele in Austria, and Roundabout Theater on Broadway — will raise questions about whether opera companies should be less orthodox in producing for their communities.

The Forum offers a unique opportunity to build relationships with fellow trustees, expand your understanding of effective governance, and bring insights from other companies back to your company. Forum participants will also have the opportunity to meet with OPERA America's new President and CEO, Michael J. Bobbitt, in a roundtable discussion about the future of the field.

Ryan Taylor, general director of Minnesota Opera, joins Dan Cooperman, chief advancement officer of OPERA America, in co-facilitating the Forum, alongside a slate of expert speakers and special guests.

Featured sessions include:

- **Opening the Hood on Opera Company Budgets:** A close look at how different production models shape financial sustainability and artistic opportunity.
- **Case Studies in Innovation:** Examples from Europe to Broadway that are redefining opera production through innovative creative approaches.
- **Board Accountability:** A practical discussion on how boards can evaluate their own performance through self-assessment, clear leadership roles, and transparent collaboration with senior staff.
- **Building Financial Resilience:** Insights into the board's role in endowment campaigns and long-term fundraising to strengthen financial security and donor engagement.
- **Understanding Audience Behavior:** New research on audience trends with discussion on how companies are applying data to attract and retain the next generation of patrons.
- **Advocacy in Action:** An update on current cultural policy issues and a guide to how trustees can become more effective advocates at the federal, state, and local levels.

The National Trustee Forum is open to board members of OPERA America's Professional Company Members.
