Vaccination Requirement

As of September 1, in accordance with New York City's new executive order regarding vaccination regulations for performance venues, the National Opera Center will require proof of one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine and matching identification for all guests 12 years or older who seek entry to the facility.

As determined by city officials, sufficient proof of vaccination may be demonstrated by displaying one of the following:

- Photo or hard copy of a CDC vaccination card
- NYC COVID Safe app
- New York State Excelsior Pass app
- Photo or hard copy of an official vaccination record for the Johnson & Johnson, Moderna, or Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine
- Photo or hard copy of an official vaccination record for a vaccine administered outside the U.S, limited to AstraZeneca/SK Bioscience, Serum Institute of India/COVISHIELD, Vaxzevria, Sinopharm, and Sinovac

Examples of acceptable identification include driver's license, non-driver government ID card, IDNYC, passport, and school ID card.

Individuals under the age of 12 may enter the National Opera Center so long as they wear a face mask in public areas.

Unvaccinated individuals 12 years of age and older will not be granted access to the facility.
